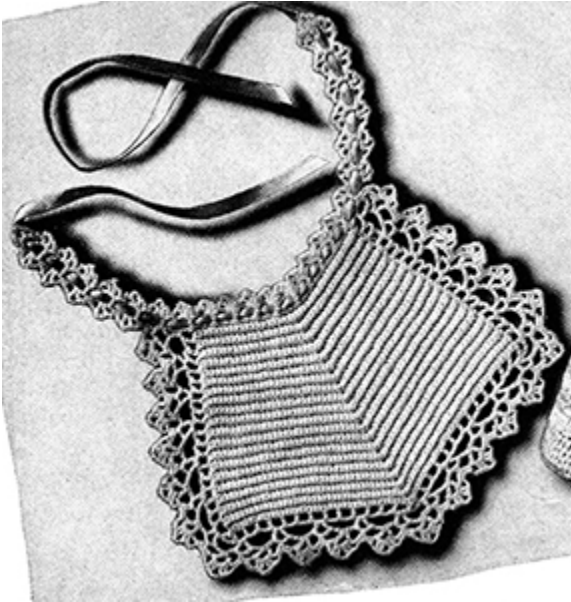


Infant's Bib Pattern 01



I edited this pattern from my collection of vintage patterns to include information about the original thread and where to buy substitutions. I also included a pattern using UK terms for all my overseas friends. This is a vintage pattern and out of copyright in the US. Feel free to use it any way you want. You may edit it, change it, and create items for both personal and business uses. The only thing I ask is that you not include my edited portion in any books you offer for sale.

**Materials Required—AMERICAN THREADCOMPANY
"SILLATEEN SANSIL" 2 60-YD. BALLS WHITE**

Steel Crochet Hook No. 10 (1.30mm).

For this size hook, I'd use

SIZE 30 Super fine

DMC brand. I have seen this at Michaels. Herrschner's carries nine colors of this thread. This is a cotton thread so if you want more colors, you would need to use fabric dye or paint

Narrow Ribbon.

Pattern in US terms.

1st Row—Ch 38, sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sc in each remaining ch, ch 1, turn.

2nd Row—Working in back loop of stitch only, 1 sc in each of the next 18 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 1 sc in next 18 sc, ch 1, turn.

3rd Row—1 sc in each sc.

4th Row—1 sc in each sc to center, 3 sc in center st, 1 sc in each remaining st, ch 1, turn.

Repeat 3rd and 4th rows until there are 20 ribs or 40 rows, break thread.

EDGING. Join thread at side of neck, ch 5, dc in next rib * ch 2, dc in next rib, repeat from * 17 times, ch 2, dc in same space (corner) work 13 2-ch meshes to center of bib ch 2, dc in same space. Work other half to correspond.

2nd Row–Turn and sl st into mesh, ch 6, dc in same space, * ch 5, skip 2 meshes, 2 dc with ch 3 between in next mesh, repeat from * across row, skipping only 1 mesh at points, turn.

3rd Row–Sl st to center of 3 ch loop, * ch 3, dc in center st of next ch, ch 3, dc in same space, ch 3, sc in next 3 ch loop, repeat from * across row, turn.

4th Row–2 sc over 1st loop * ch 2, 2 dc in next loop, ch 3, 2 dc in same loop, ch 2, 2 sc over each of the next 2 loops, repeat from * across row.

BEADING. Ch 33, break thread and attach ch to side of neck. Attach thread to other side of neck and ch 38, turn and work 1 dc in 8th st from hook, * ch 2, skip 2 chs, 1 dc in next ch, repeat from * across chain working 2 ch meshes across bib, work other ch to correspond.

2nd Row–Turn, sl st to mesh, ch 5, 1 dc in same mesh, * ch 2, 2 sc in next mesh, ch 2, 1 dc in next mesh, ch 3, 1 dc in same mesh, repeat from * around both sides of beading, and neck edge of bib.

Lace ribbon through beading.

Pattern in UK terms.

1st Row–Ch 38, dc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 dc in each remaining ch, ch 1, turn.

2nd Row–Working in back loop of stitch only, 1 dc in each of the next 18 dc, 3 dc in next dc, 1 dc in next 18 dc, ch 1, turn.

3rd Row–1 dc in each dc.

4th Row–1 dc in each dc to center, 3 dc in center st, 1 dc in each remaining st, ch 1, turn.

Repeat 3rd and 4th rows until there are 20 ribs or 40 rows, break thread.

EDGING. Join thread at side of neck, ch 5, tr in next rib * ch 2, tr in next rib, repeat from * 17 times, ch 2, tr in same space (corner) work 13 2-ch meshes to center of bib ch 2, tr in same space. Work other half to correspond.

2nd Row–Turn and sl st into mesh, ch 6, tr in same space, * ch 5, skip 2 meshes, 2 tr with ch 3 between in next mesh, repeat from * across row, skipping only 1 mesh at points, turn.

3rd Row–Sl st to center of 3 ch loop, * ch 3, tr in center st of next ch, ch 3, tr in same space, ch 3, dc in next 3 ch loop, repeat from * across row, turn.

4th Row–2 dc over 1st loop * ch 2, 2 tr in next loop, ch 3, 2 tr in same loop, ch 2, 2 dc over each of the next 2 loops, repeat from * across row.

BEADING. Ch 33, break thread and attach ch to side of neck. Attach thread to other side of neck and ch 38, turn and work 1 tr in 8th st from hook, * ch 2, skip 2 chs, 1 tr in next ch, repeat from * across chain working 2 ch meshes across bib, work other ch to correspond.

2nd Row–Turn, sl st to mesh, ch 5, 1 tr in same mesh, * ch 2, 2 dc in next mesh, ch 2, 1 tr in next mesh, ch 3, 1 tr in same mesh, repeat from * around both sides of beading, and neck edge of bib.

Lace ribbon through beading.
