## Pin Cushion Pattern \#G-110



I edited this pattern from my collection of vintage patterns to include information about the original thread and where to buy substitutions. I also included a pattern using UK terms for all my overseas friends. This is a vintage pattern and out of copyright in the US. Feel free to use it any way you want. You may edit it, change it, and create items for both personal and business uses. The only thing $I$ ask is that you not include my edited portion in any books you offer for sale.
MATERIALS: J. \& P. Coats or Clark's O.N.T. Best Six Cord Mercerized
Crochet, Size 30 (Small Ball), 1 ball ...
Any size 30 thread should work
Steel Crochet Hook No. 10 (1.30mm)
A metal ring, bit of pink ribbon.
Pattern in US terms.
Sc closely around ring. Join with sl st to first sc.
1st row: Ch 3, working in the front loops only of each sc , dc in the same place as sl st, in same sc make dc, ch 2 and 2 dc; ch 3 , skip 2 sc, dc in next 25 sc, ch 3, skip 2 sc, in next sc make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc (shell made). Ch 5, turn.
2nd row: Shell in sp of shell (shell made over shell), ch 3, (dc in next dc, ch 1) 24 times; dc in next dc, ch 3 , shell over shell. Ch 5 , turn.
3rd row: Shell over shell, ch 3, skip next sp, sc in next sp, (ch 3, sc in next sp) 23 times; ch 3, shell over shell. Ch 5, turn.
4th row: Shell over shell, ch 3, skip next sp, sc in next loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) 22 times; ch 3, shell over shell. Ch 5, turn.
5th row: Shell over shell, ch 3, skip next sp, sc in next loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) 21 times; ch 3, shell over shell. Ch 5, turn.
Continue in this manner, having 1 loop less on each row until 1 loop remains. Ch 5, turn.
Next row: Shell over shell, ch 3, skip next sp, sc in next loop, ch 3, 2 dc in sp
of next shell, ch 1 , sl st in sp of last shell made, ch 1,2 dc in same shell where last 2 dc were made, ch 5, turn; sc in joining of last 2 shells. Break off.

Attach thread to back loop of same sc as first shell was made, work exactly as for other side, picking up back loops only.
Lace ribbon through ch-3 sps, joining both sides around cushion. Tie into bow at top. Pattern in UK terms.

Dc closely around ring. Join with sl st to first dc.
1st row: Ch 3, working in the front loops only of each dc, tr in the same place as sl st, in same dc make tr, ch 2 and 2 tr; ch 3, skip 2 dc, tr in next 25 dc, ch 3, skip 2 dc, in next dc make 2 tr, ch 2 and 2 tr (shell made). Ch 5, turn.
2nd row: Shell in sp of shell (shell made over shell), ch 3 , ( $t r$ in next $t r$, ch 1 ) 24 times; tr in next tr, ch 3 , shell over shell. Ch 5, turn.
3rd row: Shell over shell, ch 3, skip next sp, dc in next $s p$, (ch 3 , dc in next $s p$ ) 23 times; ch 3 , shell over shell. Ch 5 , turn.
4th row: Shell over shell, ch 3 , skip next sp, dc in next loop, (ch 3, dc in next loop) 22 times; ch 3, shell over shell. Ch 5, turn.
5th row: Shell over shell, ch 3, skip next sp, dc in next loop, (ch 3, dc in next loop) 21 times; ch 3 , shell over shell. Ch 5, turn.
Continue in this manner, having 1 loop less on each row until 1 loop remains. Ch 5, turn.
Next row: Shell over shell, ch 3, skip next sp, dc in next loop, ch 3, 2 tr in sp of next shell, ch 1 , sl st in sp of last shell made, ch 1,2 tr in same shell where last 2 tr were made, ch 5, turn; dc in joining of last 2 shells. Break off.

Attach thread to back loop of same dc as first shell was made, work exactly as for other side, picking up back loops only.
Lace ribbon through ch-3 sps, joining both sides around cushion. Tie into bow at top.
